## Project Aid assists Gambian rural health centre

**PROJECT Aid to the Third World, a German organisation has donated three vehicles, medicines and medical equipment worth 150,000 German marks (equivalent to about D885.000 to the Jahally Health Centre in the MacCarty Island Division.**

The vehicles comprised of a 7.5 tonnes truck which was loaded with the medicines and medical equipment, an ambulance and a four-wheel drive Nissan Pickup.

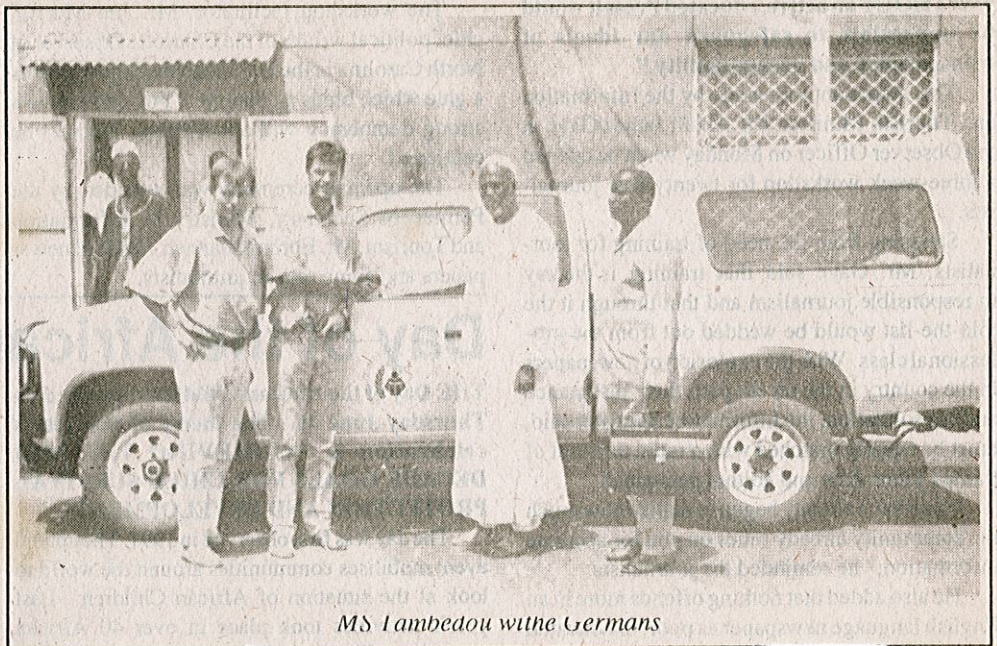
The donation was made possible from monies raised by members of the organisation in Germany. The leader of the seven-man team which came with the gift, Mr Marthias Rattelar, said all seven are professionals in various medical fields, and they will stay for a for night to assist the staff at the health centre. Among them is a Bosnian doctor who is a Muslim refugee in Germany.

The team, riding in the ambulance, left Germany on May 20 over land passing through Belgium, Morocco and the Mauritania desert, Senegal to The Gambia.

The vehicles and medical items donated were on Tuesday shown to the Minister of Health and Social Welfare, Mr Landing Jallow Sonko and the Minister for Local Government

and Lands, Alhaji Yaya Ceesay. The organisation has a Gambian chairman in the person of

Alhaji M.S. Tamedu, and is seeking to establish as a local non-governmental organisation.
